RULES AND REGULATIONS OF WORTHING ISLAMIC MADRASAH

Admission and Enrolment

- We accept Muslim children from Worthing and the surrounding area.
- We accept children aged (a) Boys from 5 to 15 years (b) Girls from 5 to 12 years.
- We strongly advise that children are enrolled in the January month after starting reception year in School. This will ensure that they have ample time to complete the set Madrasah syllabus.
- Admission of children with special needs will be subject to discussion with the Imam/teacher and the Committee.
- Admissions will be accepted at particular times of the year which will be announced. For new admissions, a birth certificate may be requested to confirm age.
- No child will be looked after or allowed to attend classes prior to formal admission. Parents must respect this and not ask the Imam/teacher for any exceptions to the rule.

Fees

- Monthly fees are £25 for the first child, £37.50 for two children and £45 for 3 children paid over 12 months.
- All payments must be made monthly via standing order. Payments in cash are time consuming for both teachers and admin.

Attendance

- Children must attend classes regularly except when absence is due to illness or other serious reasons. A note or message of absence must be sent to the Imam/teacher.
- The parents of any child who is going to miss classes continuously for 2 weeks or more must meet with the Imam/teacher and take a verbal report of the child's progress. This meeting should take place one week before the child's leave.
- The Imam/teacher will not be responsible for the progress of any child absent for 30% or more of the classes.

Class Times

 Juz Amma and Quran Children: Tue, Thurs 4pm – 6pm and Sun 11am – 1pm.

Drop off and Collect:

- Children should be dropped off and collected from the Madrasah at the correct time.
- Parents must ensure that their children arrive safely to the upper hall of the Masjid where the classes take place and are collected from there at the end of class.
- Children who are in year 3 and below will not be able to leave the Madrasah until a parent/guardian has arrived to collect them.
- If parents want their year 3 or younger children to walk home with an older sibling/pupil, they must notify us of this in writing. In this case the Madrasah will not be responsible once the child has left the Madrasah premises.

Child Safety and Safeguarding

- Please refer to the "Child Safety" and "Anti Bullying" documents which can be downloaded from the Worthing Masjid website.
- Worthing Masjid takes the matter of Safeguarding and Child Safety extremely seriously.

<u>Syllabus</u>

- Please refer to the "Syllabus" document which can be downloaded from the Worthing Masjid Website
- Teachings in this Madrasah are to a set syllabus and no individual lessons will be given.
- Parents/guardians are obliged to see the Imam/teacher twice a year for parents' evening. It is strongly advised that they meet with the Imam/teacher to discuss their child's/children's progress. Appointments should be made out of class time. A letter will be sent to all parents 2 weeks prior to the parent's evening.

Uniform (Children MUST be in uniform)

- For Boys: White/Cream Jubbah and white Cap (Topi).
- For Girls: Black Hijab with Black Burqa (covering the upper body from the head to the hands)

(Excuse of the uniform being in the wash will not be accepted)

• Children will be assessed twice a year. Reports will be sent out to parents. Please read the report and discuss with the Head Teacher if you have any concerns.
